SERVICE DEPARTMENT

The Service Department has distributed leaf bags to all residents who came to pick them up. Leaf collection is managed through the use of leaf bags. The Village does not have the means to collect leaves that have been dumped at the curb. If you have leaves at the curb, please place them in leaf bags. This will enable the streets to be clear for possible snow removal.

The Service Department would like you to know that snow removal will take place, just like in past years, with the main roads requiring attention first. The neighborhood streets will be taken care of as soon as possible. Please remember to move vehicles off the roads to allow the plow crews to do the best possible job. Your help with this process will be appreciated. The department's branch chipping service will not take place when the streets need snow removal. Safe roads are our first priority. Reminder: Rumpke requests residents to place leaf bags and waste containers in the same spot.

Dump Truck Service

During the winter months, depending on the weather, the dump trucks may not be available. The trucks are equipped with snow removal equipment and can't be lent out. Regular dump truck service will resume when snow season is over.

Residential Waste Collection

The Village contracts with Rumpke Services to provide curbside waste collection for residents. Trash and recycle bins should be placed at the curb the night before your scheduled collection day. Collection is between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday or Tuesday. Regularly scheduled pick up on Christmas or New Year's Day will be on a one day delay. Rumpke Services will pick up items such as carpet pieces and upholstered furniture. **Carpet needs to be cut into 4' lengths, rolled and tied. Upholstered furniture, mattresses, and box springs need to be wrapped in plastic before placing at the curb. Please call Rumpke Services directly, 800-828-8171, to schedule a pick up date.** In the event that a new trash or recycle bin is needed, contact Rumpke Services directly.

Car Seat Installation and Inspections

In the United States alone, there are approximately 6 million car accidents each year, 27% of which end up as a non-fatal injury and 6% end up in death. About one quarter of these unfortunate accidents occur on icy or snowy roads. So, this holiday season, take the time to make sure your little one is as safe and secure as possible from inclement weather by scheduling to have your child's car seat inspected or installed by the Evendale Fire Department.

If you've received a new car seat, or just want to make sure your current seat is safe and installed correctly, our CPS certified car seat techs can help you out! Our certified firefighters have attended over 40 hours of training with the National Child Passenger Safety program and undergo continuous education each year to learn how to correctly install all kinds of car seats into all kinds of vehicles to make sure your precious cargo is as safe as possible. We provide training on how to properly install a car seat yourself, properly adjust the harness straps and provide information on when to switch your child to forward facing or booster seats. We want you to leave here feeling confident in your child's car seat and your ability to install and properly adjust one yourself. However, we always encourage you to come back in if you have any questions or just need more assistance

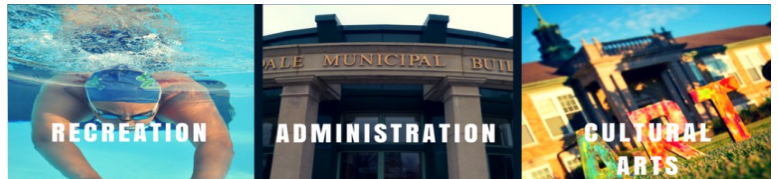
