Dear Neighbors and Friends,

The Village is aware that the February newsletter was late. Frankly, it was not the fault of our printer. As I understand it, the addresses failed to show on the mailing once received by the Post Office. When the Post Office was unable to read the addresses on the newsletter, they threw them away! The process started again with the printer reprinting the newsletters. We apologize for the delay.

The village is entering into an economic development venture with Enable Injections Inc., who moved into Evendale in 2015. They developed and recently received FDA approval for a device that attaches to your body to dispense medications. It is the first ever wearable device to administer large volumes of medication subcutaneously without being attached to an IV or syringe pump. Enable Injections is asking for a subsidy to renovate and expand their building on Sharon Road, converting it to their administrative offices and headquarters. They will then move manufacturing to Springdale. Evendale has entered into an agreement to pay them \$400,000 in 2024 and another \$400,000 in 2025. Then in seven years, they will get another \$200,000 only if they have met certain work projections. Evendale expects to earn an additional 1.2 million in tax revenue. In return, Enable Injections has agreed to keep their headquarters in Evendale for at least ten years. Many economists predict that they will be a \$40 billion-dollar company. We believe that it is a long-term benefit to the Village, and we are excited about their future.

The Police Chief would like your input. We wish to present a strong impact statement to the court about the people affected by the Christmas Day shootings which ended with a crash into a utility pole causing a power outage of up to eleven hours in Evendale. Incidentally, the Flock cameras were instrumental in catching those criminals. The latest camera was recently installed on Gateclub Drive. These cameras have proven helpful in solving dozens of crimes.

Kingsport Paving Update

Shortly after the paving was completed on Kingsport, it was discovered that the surface was unraveling in several areas. The contractor and material supplier performed tests on the asphalt and determined that the material was lacking in asphalt content. The contractor and supplier have determined that the surface will need to be redone. This work is anticipated to be performed later this spring as weather permits.

Brush Chipping Regulations

- All items to be chipped are to be at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on Monday morning.
- Tree limbs and branches should be no larger than 8" in diameter.
- Pile tree limbs neatly with the stalk end at the curb.
- The following <u>CANNOT</u> be chipped: vines, garden waste, wood with nails or bushes with an excessive amount of dirt on roots. All vines and garden waste should be in bags for Rumpke pickup, not more than 50 pounds.
- Please remove the root ball from trees and bushes for pickup.

It is the responsibility of the resident to have contractors, tree surgeons, landscapers, etc., remove their own materials and waste from the property.

REMINDER:

Grass clippings and leaves must be bagged and set out at the curb for pickup by Rumpke, not more than 50 pounds.

Reminder: Rumpke requests residents to place leaf bags and waste containers in the same spot. **Rumpke will only stop one time per house!**

TAX DEPARTMENT

2023 Evendale Income Tax Return - The due date for filing the 2023 Evendale Income Tax Return, and paying the tax due, is April 15, 2024. Tax forms are available on our website, https://www.evendaleohio.org/tax-department and in the lobby of the Village Administration Department.

E-file/E-pay – The E-file system is available for most individuals to file their 2023 Evendale Individual Income Tax Return. An E-pay system is included with the E-file system, allowing for payment of the balance of tax due by credit card. The E-file system may be accessed by visiting our website at https://www.evendaleohio.org/tax-department. Credit card payments will be accepted without assessment of a convenience fee by the 3rd party credit card processor (some restrictions may apply). VI-SA, MasterCard and Discover are accepted.

NEW THIS YEAR – You may also make an online tax payment by credit card at any time, even if you are not filing your tax return via the E-file system. Visit our website at https://www.evendaleohio.org/tax-department and select "Make a Tax Payment Online." Credit card payments will be accepted without assessment of a convenience fee by the 3rd party credit card processor (some restrictions may apply). VISA, MasterCard and Discover are accepted.

Work From Home - If you requested a refund from your work place city for the tax year 2023 because you worked from home, your resident credit for Tax Paid to Another Municipality (Evendale Individual Income Tax Return, Line 5c) must be reduced for the refund received from your work place city.

Taxpayer Assistance – In-person taxpayer assistance remains by appointment only at this time. Taxpayer assistance is also available by telephone and by email.

Dropping off Tax Information - If you need to visit our office to drop off tax return information or to drop off your completed tax return, you may do so at the Administration Lobby window, M-F 8:00am to 4:00pm. After normal business hours, you may also use the secured Tax Department Drop Box located in the Lobby of our Police Department. The Police Department Lobby is open 24/7.






