On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, GE Aerospace held a special event, at their Evendale world headquarters, to celebrate their official stand-alone company status. Hamilton County Commissioner Driehaus and I attended the celebration and had a chance to converse with Larry Culp, the CEO. I asked Mr. Culp why GE picked Evendale for their world headquarters. He responded that it was a "no-brainer"; GE Aviation had been in Evendale for 70-plus years, making our community the most logical place to continue company operations. Mr. Culp seemed very down to earth , committed to the region as a whole, and focused on maintaining GE Aerospace's ranking as the world's largest manufacturer of jet engines. This all bodes well for our community.

Located in Evendale, I-Space, the non-profit organization specializing in STEM-related educational programs, wants to "spread its wings". I am taking them to Dayton to look for ways that public television can help. Dayton Public TV has a program called "The Wright Brothers Innovative". I think it is a perfect fit for I-Space.

With the growing season upon us, our code enforcement department receives calls from residents concerned about overgrown yards. If you let your grass take over your yard, you may likely receive a friendly reminder, in the form of a door hanger or notice, to cut your grass. Most residents do an excellent job maintaining their yards, but we have a few that don't. Thank you to everyone for keeping Evendale beautiful!

Intel continues to build out its plant in Central Ohio. I read where they are bringing in equipment and supplies by barge on the Ohio River in Adams County, and transporting them to the job site. Very unique.

I recently attended REDI Cincinnati's 10th Anniversary celebration. REDI is the State of Ohio's the economic development agency for the region. One of our new manufacturing businesses, The General Tool Company (GTC), was honored with an award for their new building in Evendale's AeroHub District. GTC expects to open this month. They make huge power units for Navy destroyers. It was a great night!



We are starting a lock box program for rental houses in the Village. This allows a box outside the door to the residence to contain a key to the house. The key to the box will be with the Fire Department. In case of a fire, they can access the residence quickly without smashing the door. It will not be mandatory, only a service to those landlords who want it.

#### From the Police Department......

Recently we have seen several thefts from vehicle incidents here in Evendale and wanted to offer some general safety reminders. Usually, those who commit these crimes would not qualify as rocket scientists and deterring them can be pretty simple. Generally, if they something of value they take it. So, never leave these things in your vehicle, especially at night when you go to bed:

- FIREARMS !!!!
- Phones/Tablets/Computers
- Backpacks/Purses/Laptop Bags
- Wallets/Cash/Credit Cards/Identification/Checks
- Shopping bags with merchandise
- Extra car keys to any of your vehicles

Other helpful tips include parking in areas that are well lit or have motion activated spotlights. The use of external security cameras. While it is very convenient to leave a garage door opener in your vehicle it is also giving potential thieves an open invitation into your garage.

The vast majority of thieves we see here do not break car windows – they tend to just pull on door handles to find an unlocked one, so always **LOCK YOUR DOORS!** 







#### FIRE DEPARTMENT

#### **Help us Find Your Home**

As you work on your landscaping this spring and summer, the fire department has a few tips that will help us find your address in the event of an emergency. While maintaining your home's exterior, consider how well your address numbers can be seen from the road. Quickly locating your home's address saves us valuable time in response to an emergency. Here are some considerations when labeling your home address:

- Use plain numerals. Scripted or spelled out numbers look nice; however, they are not easily or quickly identifiable from our approaching vehicles.
- Address numbers should be displayed on front of your house, at a mailbox, or post at the end of the driveway if your house is set back off the main roadway. When displaying your address on the front of the house, make sure that it is in a well-lit location. This will ensure that the numbers are clear and obvious to emergency responders.
- Address numbers should be at least four inches in height and of a contrasting color to their background. Reflective numbers may also be used.
- Keep address numbers clear from obstructions such as trees, shrubs, flowers, and decorations.

Fire and Medical emergency response outcomes are often very time sensitive. The quicker the fire department can identify your address, the quicker we are aiding you in your time of need. So, as you tidy up your home's landscaping this spring, take a look at your address numbers to see how easily visible they are to approaching responders.






